

2022 Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships

September 10, 2021

Dear USBC League Officials, Association Officers, Coaches: It's that time again... time for the annual Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships tournament.

The Columbus USBC Youth Association is hosting the 2022 Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships. You are receiving this packet because, according to the best information we can gather, you are an active leader in the Youth program in your area. If you are no longer involved in youth bowling, please pass this along to your local USBC officials or your bowling center's program director as soon as possible. We don't want any youth bowlers to be left out!

In this packet, you'll find everything you need to conduct league-level qualifying and to advance your bowlers to state competition. **This is a scratch competition within age groups**.

Round 1 of state competition will be held April 2-3, 2022 All Divisions U8, U10, U12, U15, & U18 will be at Bowlero Columbus, 1636 Bradley Park Dr, Columbus, GA 31904, (706) 324-4431. The state finals will take place Saturday, April 23, 2022. All divisions U8, U10, U12, U15, U18 will be at Bowlero Columbus. Coaches will receive confirmation of scheduled bowling dates and times for each bowler, together with addresses, telephone numbers and directions to the bowling center.

League-level qualifying will take place in two (2) qualifying windows encompassing four (4) league sessions. The advancement ratio from league level to state competition will be (1) for every three (3) entries per division, which will be at least 1 in 3 bowlers including last place ties. All League members in that division are counted toward your base figure in determining the number of entries per division. This includes counting absent bowlers during the qualifying window.

The first two league sessions used for qualifying are between October 18, – October 31, 2021.

The second two league sessions used for qualifying are between January 17, – January 30, 2022.

Remember, all scores used for qualifying must be bowled during regular league play. No pre-bowling or post-bowling scores are allowed. No tournament scores may be used.

The first-place winners of the U12, U15, U18 Divisions for both Girls and Boys will advance to the **2020 Junior Gold Championships to be held July 15-23, 2022 in Grand Rapids, MI**. To compete at the league and state levels, bowlers need not be a member of the USBC Junior Gold program. However, to advance to the Junior Gold Championships, state winners must be a USBC Junior Gold program member or must obtain membership prior to **June 1, 2022.** If a state winner is not eligible for the Junior Gold Championships, he/she will retain all scholarship awards from the state tournament, but the next eligible bowler will receive the berth in the Junior Gold Championships.

Entry fees for state level competition will be:

\$26 for Divisions U8 and U10 (Bowling 3 games)

\$40 for Divisions U12, U15, U18 (Bowling 6 games)

Please read all information in this package. Besides the information from national headquarters (which includes worksheets and instructions on how to conduct league-level qualifying), you will find:

- Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships rules. You should make copies of these and give one to each and every bowler. These rules describe the format for state level competition.
- 2. **State Level Entry form**. Bowlers advancing to the state level may register and pay online through the USBC Portal via the link provided in the confirmation email. If preferred, bowlers may fill out and mail the enclosed entry form and payment by the **February 18**th **deadline**. Before you send them off, make sure they are LEGIBLE and that all required blanks are filled in.

- 3. **Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships dress code**. Each bowler advancing to the state level must receive a copy and dress accordingly.
- The tournament's "No Surprises" policy covering procedures and deadlines for submitting names of alternates for Round 1 of state competition.
- Alternate State Level Entry form. The form is self-explanatory. It must be completed and is located here www.gastateusbcyouth.com/georgia-state-usbc-youth/ under Pepsi, then email to kahuna1856@hotmail.com or filled in and scanned and emailed to the kahuna1856@hotmail.com the tournament director in accordance with the "No Surprises" policy.
- 6. League Level Worksheet. The form is self-explanatory and must be submitted filled in with all league level participants, their initials indicating they accept the division they are in. If the bowlers qualify they need to be ranked (1, 2, 3, etc.) based on the highest series score of the qualifying window. The qualifiers must initial that they accept their chance to participate in the Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships tournament. Sample completed form attached.
- 7. **Pepsi Tournament Check List** Used to ensure you have all required paperwork prior to submitting your package.

Note: Only approved bowling equipment per USBC standards (Rules Chap 8 and Rule 301b) may be used. Bowling ball surfaces may only be altered prior to the first person on the squad throwing a ball, this means all equipment (Rule 18).

When qualifying is complete, bowlers that have qualified may be registered and payment submitted online **November 1, 2021 thru March 1, 2022.** You may also send a State Level Entry Form for each advancer Joe Spain at the address listed, postmarked by **February 18, 2022.** As per rule 310a entries will be accepted that are postmarked the first post office business day after the above date. **Use the Check List to make sure you didn't forget anything.**

October qualifier League Level Worksheet must be sent to Nelson Tellames postmarked by midnight on November 8, 2021 or emailed to kahuna1856@hotmail.com... Make sure that each bowler initials the worksheet showing that he/she agrees with the division in which they are being entered.

February qualifier League Level Worksheet must be sent to Nelson Tellames postmarked by midnight on February 7, 2022 or emailed to kahuna1856@hotmail.com. Make sure that each bowler initials the worksheet showing that he/she agrees with the division in which they are being entered. League standing sheets as of February 1, 2021 is required so earned awards can be identified and processed. Remember the above deadlines. If they are not met, the youth bowler(s) will be unable to participate.

Letters informing state entrants when and where they bowl in Round 1 will be emailed to you for prompt distribution to your bowlers and will also be available on the Georgia State Youth website. Please make sure valid email addresses are provided. www.gastateusbc under Youth/Pepsi. Those who advance from the first round of state play to the second round will be so advised by email to the email addresses provided.

RULES AND FORMAT

(September 2, 2021)

All participants must be given a copy of these rules and PICK THEIR OWN DIVISION

- This Pepsi USBC Youth Championships is certified by the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) (#04661) and governed by USBC rules.
- Competition is open to all 2021 2022 USBC Youth members who bowl in certified centers in Georgia. To
 compete, a bowler must be a regular member of a certified USBC league and not be under suspension at the
 time of qualifying. USBC Collegiate members are eligible if they are 2021 2022 USBC Youth members, bowl
 in a USBC Youth league and have not violated USBC Rule 400. Wheelchair and other physically challenged
 USBC Youth members are also allowed to enter and bowl.
- All USBC Youth members in good standing are eligible for the league level competition. There is no entry fee
 at the league level. Bowling centers having 2021 2022 USBC certified leagues are automatic league level
 qualifying sites.
- 4. Participants must be aware of each competition level in the state and all associated rules, fees and deadlines.
- 5. Competition will be conducted in 10 divisions based on the participant's date of birth as listed below. Participation in the wrong age division will lead to automatic disqualification. Bowlers must stay in the given division in that particular league throughout the entire window. Bowlers must declare at the time of their first qualifying window within EACH league if they choose to "play up" to a higher age division. All bowlers that choose to "play up" MUST COMPLETE a "Play Up" waiver form PRIOR to competition. There is one for the Pepsi Championships and a different one for Junior Gold based on U12 or U15 division.

^{*}One way to think about this is....If a bowler turns 9, 11, 13, or 16 during the bowling season he/she would be in the next highest age division.

There is no requirement of Junior Gold membership to enter U12, U15, U18 Divisions.

- 6. USBC earned awards are based on the member's league average as of that day.
- 7. The qualifying window average will be the current league average as of the first date of competition (no minimum number of games). Participants must remain in that division for the duration of that window. Bowlers are eligible to compete in a different division in a different league during the league level of competition.
- 8. League level qualifying windows are October 18 October 31, 2021 and January 17 January 30, 2022.
- 9. Qualifying scores must be bowled during regularly scheduled league play. **Pre-bowled or post-bowled scores are not allowed.** Advancement to the next competition level will be from the league level.
- 10. Bowlers can attempt to qualify in any state where they hold a 2021-2022 USBC Youth membership card.

 However, the bowler can only advance once using the following criteria:

- A. In the event a bowler qualifies in more than one league in the same division, the bowler must advance from the league where the highest series was bowled. For identical qualifying scores, the member will advance from the league where the first score was bowled.
- B. If a bowler qualifies in different leagues from multiple divisions, the bowler **must** select one division they will compete in before subsequent competition.
- C. If the bowler advances out of league level in more than one state/zone, the bowler **must** declare one state to continue competing in before the next competition level.
- D. Participation in any level of competition past the league level in more than one state/zone will result in automatic disqualification.
- 11. If any bowler who qualified at the league level cannot participate in the state competition, an alternate will be chosen based on order of finish in the same qualifying league division.
- 12. Advancement ratio from league level to state competition will be one (1) for every three (3) participants per division, which is at least 1 for every 3 entries per division, or major fraction thereof, including last place ties. The base number for each division is the number of league members that would have participated in that division. In all cases at least one (1) person per division shall advance. The advancement ratio (1:3) shall be applied uniformly to all divisions.
 - A. Examples: If there are 20 bowlers in a division, and you divide your number of bowlers by 3 and get a major fraction which is 1 more than ½ or greater then you get to send that extra bowler, example: 20 divided by 3 equals 6.6 meaning five (5) bowlers may advance to the State Championships.
 - B. If there is a tie between the last two qualifiers for advancement, both will advance.
 - C. Advancers remain in the division they qualified in during the league level in all subsequent competition.
- 13. Round 1 of state competition will take place April 2 3, 2022:

Divisions U8, U10 will be at Bowlero Columbus, 1636 Bradley Park Dr, Columbus, GA 31904, (706) 324-4431.

Divisions U12, U15, U18 will be at Bowlero Columbus, 1636 Bradley Park Dr, Columbus, GA 31904, (706) 324-4431

The finals will take place Saturday, April 23, 2022.

All divisions U8, U10, U12, U15, U18 will be at Bowlero Columbus, 1636 Bradley Park Dr, Columbus, GA 31904, (706) 324-4431.

Coaches will receive confirmation of scheduled bowling dates and times for each bowler, together with addresses, telephone numbers and directions to the bowling center. This information will also be posted on the Georgia State USBC website at www.gastateusbc.com/georgia-state-usbc-youth under Pepsi.

14. Entries and payments can be submitted via the online USBC tournament portal. A link to the website will be provided via email. All online entries and payments must be submitted by March 1, 2022. Entries may also be submitted via mail no later than February 18, 2022. As per rule 310a entries will be accepted that are postmarked the first post office business day after the above dates. An entry form for each qualifier (with all information blanks completed) along with the appropriate entry fees must be submitted to the Georgia State USBC Association Manager at the below address:

Money Orders & League Checks only will be accepted and must be made payable to: Georgia State USBC.

Bowlers that qualify during the October window are encouraged to submit their entries beginning November 1, 2021 to secure their desired squad date and time.

- 15. Tournament format is as follows: In the first round of state competition (April 2-3, 2022), Bowlers in the **U8 and U10 divisions will bowl three (3) games** on the same pair of lanes. Bowlers in the **U12, U15 U18 divisions will bowl six (6) games**, moving one pair of lanes after each game. Total Round 1 pinfall will determine qualifiers for the final round of competition. (There will be no carryover of pins from the first round). The top 10 percent in each division will continue to the final round (April 23, 2022), where they will bowl three (3) additional games. Divisions U8 and U10 will not change lanes. Divisions U12, U15, U18 will move one pair of lanes after each game. Total pinfall for these three games will determine the final five qualifiers in each division who will advance to a stepladder competition. Those bowlers advancing to the final round of state competition on April 23, 2022, will be notified by mail. The top four (4) alternates in each division will also be notified.
- 16. There are no fees for league-level qualifying, Entry fees for round 1 of state level competition are:

No additional fees are charged for the final round of state competition. All award and scholarship fees will be returned 100 % to the bowlers within each division. The SMART program will manage all scholarships awarded. The Georgia State Pepsi YBC SMART account number is 8517. The SMART Program can be contacted at 1-800-514-2695, Ext 8292. Fax Ext 8266. Email: smart@bowl.com. (USBC Rules 301d and 309). NOTE: Scholarship funds cannot be utilized by the recipient prior to high school graduation.

17. Participants are expected to wear suitable attire during competition. All clothes must be neat, clean and free of holes or frayed hemlines. Acceptable Tops include full length shirts or bowling jerseys with polo, butterfly, or sash collars, or t-shirts with league logos. Acceptable Bottoms include pants, nice jeans, capris, walking/casual shorts no more than 2 inches above the knees, skirts and/or skorts at least fingertip length.

Attire or equipment depicting alcohol, illegal substances, gambling, or inappropriate language/gestures is forbidden in accordance with USBC Rule 103b.

Tournament Officials will determine appropriate attire, and those decisions are final.

- 18. Only approved bowling equipment per USBC standards may be used (USBC Rule Chap 8 and Rule 301b). Check on Bowl.com on the "Equipment Specifications" link under USBC Departments. Bowling ball surfaces may only be altered prior to the first person on the squad throwing a ball, this means all equipment. (USBC Rules 17a, 18, Chapter 8: Equipment specifications in the Playing Rule Book).
- 19. No substitutes will be permitted. Alternates may be used for bowlers who are not present at squad time. Alternates may be chosen only from the same division as the bowler who has dropped out and in the order of finish at the prior level. Replacement of alternates will NOT be made on the assigned day of bowling. Exceptions will be made only under dire extenuating circumstances, and then only at the discretion of the tournament director. Use the Alternate Entry Form and submit to the tournament director no later than the 9:00 PM the day before competition.
- Competitors will be allowed 10 minutes of practice time prior to bowling for score on their starting pair of lanes only.
- 21. If no replacements have been made, because the bowler has informed the tournament director that he/she will be late, then the bowler arriving late shall begin play and the score shall count beginning with the frame being

bowled. Frames missed shall be credited with a zero (0). A bowler not present and ready to bowl when it is his/her turn will receive a zero (0) for that frame.

- 22. Only bowlers and tournament officials shall be permitted in the bowling area.
- 23. In state finals competition, all ties will be broken by a one game roll-off (when necessary to determine advancement). If a tie still exists, it will be broken by an additional ninth and tenth frame roll-off. (USBC Rule 326a).
- 24. Claims for errors in scoring or general playing rules must be made to the tournament director no later than the start of the next block or 30 minutes after the completion of the tournament. The tournament director shall decide upon questionable errors. All other protests must be confirmed in writing to the tournament director within 72 hours of the infraction. Under this rule, each protest must be specific in itself. Awards will be presented immediately following the completion of the stepladder competition. (USBC Rules 327a, 327b, 327c, 328 and 329 apply).
- 25. Symbolic awards will be given on a 1-in-10 ratio (USBC Rule 308c). Each of the top five finishers in each of the ten divisions will receive a scholarship; that is, all bowlers competing in the stepladder finals will receive scholarships.
- 26. The first-place winners of the U12, U15 and U18 divisions for both Girls and Boys will advance to the 2022 Junior Gold Championships in Grand Rapids, MI, July 15-23, 2022. They must be USBC Junior Gold members to advance to the Junior Gold Championships. Bowlers without a current Junior Gold membership must purchase a Junior Gold membership prior to June 8, IBC Youth will waive the \$200 (U18), \$150 (U15), and \$100 (U12) entry fee for these athletes. These athletes will compete for additional scholarships available to all athletes at the Junior Gold Championships, as well as other prizes and awards. All U.S. citizens are vying for a spot on USBC Junior Team USA 2023 to represent the United States in national and international competition. If the U12, U15 or U18 Division Champion is unwilling to become a Junior Gold member, they will not advance to the Junior Gold Championships. However, the athlete will still retain the state/zone scholarship, but the berth to the Junior Gold Championships will be awarded to the next eligible athlete. If the U12, U15, U18 Division Champion is unwilling or unable to become a USBC Junior Gold member, they will not advance to the Junior Gold Championships. However, the athlete will still retain the state scholarship, but the berth to the Junior Gold Championships will be awarded to the next eligible athlete. Eligible advancers must agree to bowl in the Junior Gold Championships, or, failing to do so, agree to waive all rights. Replacements will be selected based on order of finish in their division at state competition. Replacements will incur all costs associated with changing the airline ticket, if applicable. If the eligible advancer decides not to attend the Junior Gold Championships, any stipends offered will be forfeited. However, any scholarships earned at the state level will be retained. If the first-place winners have already earned a spot into the Junior Gold Championships, he/she would retain the scholarship or stipend assigned to their finishing position and the Junior Gold berth would go to the next eligible athlete
- 27. All advancers to Junior Gold Championships should expect to be accompanied by a parent, guardian or coach. Also, the advancer must remain in Grand Rapids, MI for approximately eight (8) days.
- 28. All matters not covered by these rules and regulations shall be determined by the Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships Tournament Committee. The National Pepsi Youth Championships Tournament Committee reserves the right to accept or reject any participant.

Surprises: a luxury we can no longer afford

To All Pepsi Coordinators, Coaches:

A tournament that does not run on time and in an orderly manner is not a fair tournament. We are committed to starting every squad of the 2022 Georgia Pepsi USBC Youth Championships on time. We expect a very large number of bowlers again this year, and nearly all of the squads will be chocked full.

Therefore, replacement of entrants by alternates will NOT be made on the assigned day of bowling. Exceptions will be made only under dire extenuating circumstances, and then only at the discretion of the tournament director.

If you need to make a substitution for a player scheduled to bowl on Saturday, April 10 you must scan/email an "<u>Alternate Entry Form</u>" to the Tournament Director, Nelson Tellames at <u>kahuna1856@hotmail.com</u> <u>by 9 PM</u> <u>Friday, April 1st.</u> Please call before and after emailing to verify I received your email.

If you need to make a substitution for a player scheduled to bowl on Sunday, April 3rd, you must scan/email an "<u>Alternate Entry Form</u>" to the Tournament Director, Nelson Tellames at <u>kahuna1856@hotmail.com</u> <u>by 9 PM Saturday, April 2nd.</u> Please call before and after emailing to verify I received your email.

Please make a follow-up call to Tournament Director, Nelson Tellames (912)655-1699(cell), or an e-mail message to me at **kahuna1856@hotmail.com** A follow-up call will help insure that the information has been received.

The "Alternate Entry Form" is included in this packet. (Make photocopies of the form in case you need more than one.) Fill in all information. If an alternate does not appear on the league-qualifier worksheets you sent earlier and on the February 1, 2022 league-standing sheet you provided, you must email the documents that show the information.

At check-in, the alternate will have to show a USBC membership card, be properly dressed per the tournament dress code. The alternate must bowl in the squad and on the lanes assigned to the original entrant.

Advise your bowlers that if they realize they will not be able to come to the state tournament because of illness, injury, family emergency or any other reason, they should let you know <u>immediately</u> so you can make arrangements for an alternate to come.

Example: If Johnny breaks a leg on the Wednesday before the tournament and you wish to send an alternate, the tournament director should be notified by email or phone call immediately – and by the above deadlines at the latest.

A bowler who shows up at check-in and says, "I'm here to replace so-and-so", or a coach who shows up with several children and says, "I need to enter these alternates", will be turned away.

Finally, all bowlers must bowl at the assigned times or not at all. With full squads, we have no leeway to change squads.

To provide the best service to all players in a tournament as large as this one, we must enforce this "no surprises" policy.
